A Season for Giving Back



An empty bowl can mean a full stomach. That's what drives NWC Ceramics Instructor and Division Chair of Visual and Performing Arts Elaine DeBuhr and her students when they hold the **Empty Bowls fundraiser** for the Powell Valley Loaves and Fishes food bank. Every other year, DeBuhr and her students serve a simple meal of soup and bread for \$10 in ceramic bowls hand thrown by NWC students and faculty.

Years back, when DeBuhr was looking for a project to involve her students in community service, she read an article about Empty Bowls, a nationwide effort to raise awareness of hunger. The article crystalized her plan.

"I was aware that food bank shelves around the country, including Powell, are overwhelmed," DeBuhr said, "so Loaves and Fishes was a natural choice." In 2008, DeBuhr's students in wheelthrowing classes worked to make one hundred bowls for the crowd were hoping to feed. This year, they made and sold 419 bowls for their event, held in early November.

According to DeBuhr, "We reached our goal of \$5,000 raised for our community foodbank. It's win, win, win in my opinion. It's a warm, social event for people; it elevates the appreciation of handmade ceramics; it's a reminder of hunger in our community; and it's a much-needed financial boost for Powell Valley Loaves and Fishes."
